April 3: Briana Ingraham – "<u>Uff Dah! An</u> <u>Unexpected Journey of 1,000 miles..Northwest"</u> Grace Free Church-Bagley

Briana Ingraham is a relatively new Minnesotan, coming to us from outside Baltimore, Maryland. The path her life was on changed dramatically in August 2015 when her husband penned an article for the Washington Post on data that ranked Red Lake County, MN as the "ugliest county in America." He was invited to visit and fell in love with its beauty-but more so with its people. He then somehow convinced her to leave her government job, pack up all their belongs and head 1400 miles northwest of Maryland, with twin toddlers, a cat and a dog in tow for a fresh start outside the beltway.

She now calls Red Lake Falls home and is learning the ins and outs of a new career with the most demanding of bosses – three boys age 5 and under! Over the years she has been here she has joined various community groups and was recently elected to the Red Lake Falls city council.

April 10: Roger Hellesvig "An Immigrant's Tale". McIntosh Community Center, 115 Broadway St NW Using an immigrant trunk as the focal point, Roger tells what it was like to immigrate to Minnesota in the mid 1800's. The audience will discover the choices
